Floating Window by Yantr

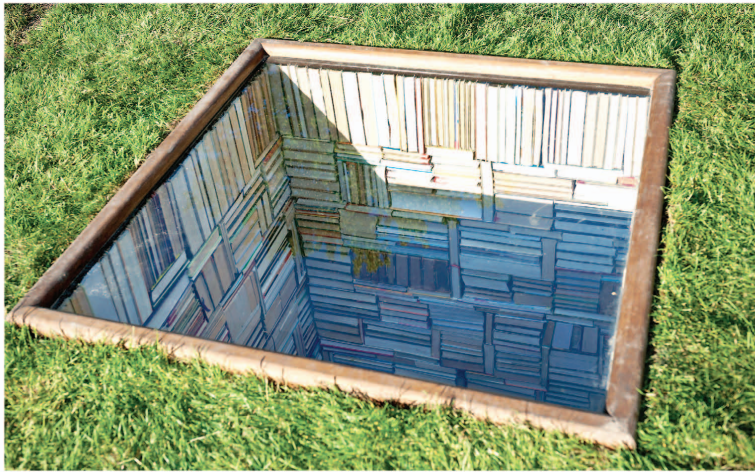
Mumbai, India, 2014

The terraces are an integral part of the sculpture, while the chair becomes the central element, which goes up into the sky. It gives a new perspective and a new dynamic to the place."
